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OVERALL GOAL OF THE PROGRAMME

The Diploma course in library and information science is an entry level qualification for prospective middle level information managers; it is suitable for people with no prior experience in information industry as well as those seeking to upgrade their professional skills. The rationale for the programme is anchored in the recognition that we live in information driven society and information is a key national resource in the development of any nation just like water, mineral deposits, land etc.

The provision of timely quality and accurate information has been recognized as one of the key elements in management, governance, decision making and economic growth. The role of information in the above aspects has been recognized and cited by various development policies including vision 2030 and UNESCO'S poverty and education strategy among others. Faced with this reality, there is a need for trained personnel with skills to collect information, evaluate, organize and disseminate it to appropriate users in timely manner.

CORE PROGRAMME LEARNING OUTCOMES

On completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Apply theoretical and functional knowledge in the field of information science.
- Collect, analyze, evaluate and preserve relevant information sources that meet user's information needs.
- Conduct fruitful search and locate relevant information.
- Apply emerging technologies to appropriately keep users abreast of new information in their field of interest and present required information in a timely manner.
- Apply innovative professional techniques such as CAS and SDI in delivery of quality library Services.
- Skillfully use emerging technologies to develop and deliver digital library services.

CLASSIFICATION OF THE DIPLOMA

The Diploma shall be classified as follows, based on the Cumulative Average Marks

CAREER PROSPECTS.

Holder of Diploma in Library Information may pursue course in:

- **Academic Libraries:** found in Colleges and Universities, with the expansion of higher education, academic libraries continue to open up opportunities for Library and Information science graduates.
- **Public Libraries:** public libraries under Kenya National Library Services and others under County Governments, Local communities, Religious organizations and NGO's create opportunities for Library and Information Science graduates.
- **Government ministries and departments:** most of Government's ministries and departments have an operational library e.g Parliament, Central bank KRA etc which create opportunities for Library and Information science graduates.
- **Media and Cultural centers:** media houses and cultural centers such as Museums usually have a library which offers opportunities to Library and Information Science graduates.
- **Research organizations:** research organizations such as KARI, employ Library and Information Science graduates to help collect data, evaluate information, organize and preserve research findings and also disseminate research findings to the public or donors

- **Private sector:** organizations such as banks, law firms, insurance firms, NGO's etc, mostly have operational libraries to cater for information needs of their organization.

PROGRAMME DURATION

The duration of the programme is 5 semesters.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

A candidate must satisfy any of the following minimum requirements:

KCSE Mean Grade of C- (Minus) or equivalent certificate in Information Science from Greta University or any other recognized institution.
